OSCE Office for Democratic Institutions and Human Rights (ODIHR)

On 01.08.2024, on the website of OSCE Office for Democratic Institutions and Human Rights, a press release was shared. According to the release, OSCE ODIHR had launched an election observation mission for Azerbaijan's parliamentary elections on 1 September 2024. Headed by Ditmir Bushati, the mission included a core team of 11 experts and 28 long-term observers, with plans to deploy 280 shortterm observers closer to election day. It was stated in the release that the mission would assess the elections' compliance with OSCE commitments, international standards and national laws, monitoring campaign conduct, election administration, media coverage and dispute resolution. It was stated that the preliminary statement of findings would be released the day after the elections, with a final report and recommendations to follow in several months.
