Such knowledges forms provides an important basis for the state's compliance with the human rights obligation to prevent violence against women. The state is obliged to prevent and combat sex-based violence through the European Convention on Human Rights (ECHR), the International Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW), and the Istanbul Convention. The UN Committee on the Elimination of Discrimination against Women also stated that sex-based violence is a form of discrimination. The National Knowledge Center on Violence and Traumatic Stress (NKVTS has recently published a national coverage study on violence and sexual abuse among the adult population in Norway. The first national scope study on the topic was carried out in 2014. The report shows that 14% of women state that they have been subjected to rape by force and coercion, compared to 2% of men.
