The report states that spatial segregation is a reflection of multiple, composite and intersecting forms of discrimination, resulting in a violation of the equal and indiscriminate enjoyment of the right to adequate housing, as well as being linked to violations of a wide range of other interrelated human rights.

United Nations Subcommittee on Prevention of Torture (SPT)	<ul> <li>As latest new, SPT made a public statement which was shared on 28 February 2022, according to this statement; UN experts call for end to Russian aggression against Ukraine and urgent protection of human rights.</li> <li>According to the statement; UN human rights experts expressed that use of force by one State against another is fundamentally unacceptable and strikes at the very heart of the object and purposes of the Charter of the United Nations and the consequences of this military attack would last for generations.</li> <li>They stressed that they were concerned about the safety and protection of everyone in Ukraine.</li> <li>They specified that the UN Charter was created expressly to settle differences between States and to peacefully prevent armed conflict and protect the right to self-determination, by doing so, it established the basis for protection of the human rights and fundamental freedoms of all people.</li> <li>Additionally, they expressed their profound dismay at the violations of the right to life, liberty and security that had already occurred.</li> <li>By the statement, they strongly urged the Russian Federation to listen to the collective voice of the international community which had unequivocally condemned its military actions as unacceptable to all.</li> </ul>

-	As latest new, SPT made an announcement which was shared on 24 March 2022, according to this announcement; SPT was set to visit Tunisia from 27 March to 2 April 2022 to assess the country's implementation of the recommendations it made during its previous visit.
	According to the announcement; Abdallah Ounnir, Chair of the four-member delegation, pointed out the vist with this words; "Tunisia was the first country in North Africa to establish a National Preventive Mechanism (NPM), which the SPT has been supporting since its inception. We are pleased to return to meet with members of the NPM to see the progress of their
	work and advise on how to make improvements." He added to his words as follows: "We will also meet with government authorities to discuss prevention policies and visit places of deprivation of liberty, which we did not do during our first visit."
	By announcement, it is informed that Tunisia ratified OPCAT in 2011 and adopted local legislation in 2013 to set up its NPM, the country's torture prevention watchdog to monitor places where people are deprived of their liberty.
	It is also specified that SPT visited Tunisia for the first time in 2016, when its NPM became operational and SPT was due to revisit Tunisia in 2020 but the trip was postponed as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.
	It is declared that the SPT delegation would also hold meetings and after the visit, the SPT would share its report with the authorities and the report would remain confidential unless opposite decision made by Tunisia

The meeting took place in a hybrid format with most members attending in person.</li> <li>During this meeting, the CPT adopted the reports on its periodic visits to Bulgaria (October 2021) and the Russian Federation (September/October 2021), as well as on its ad hoc visits to Albania (November 2021), Bosnia-Herzegovina (October 2021) and Greece (November/December 2021).</li> </ul>

- The Council of Europe's Committee for the Prevention of
Torture and Inhuman or Degrading Treatment or Punishment
(CPT) has published today the report on its 5th periodic visit to
Serbia from 9 to 19 March 2021 together with the response
from the authorities.
In the course of the visit, a significant number of credible
allegations of torture and other forms of ill-treatment of
detained persons by police officers were received by the CPT's
delegation. These allegations consisted of slaps, punches, kicks
and truncheon blows as well as the application of electro-
shocks by hand-held devices and by electric cables connected
to a car battery and the placing of persons in stress positions
during police interviews. The allegations were supported by
documentation examined at police establishments and by
detailed injury reports recorded by prison health care staff at
the moment persons were admitted to prison. The report
recommends that the Serbian authorities adopt more resolute
measures to eradicate police ill-treatment, including the
introduction of an investigative interviewing approach of
criminal suspects and the mandatory audio and video recording
of police interviews.
