Institute emphasized the Federal Government's fundamental and human rights protection obligations that result in a concrete obligation to bring local staff, particularly vulnerable Afghans and their relatives safely to Germany. It is declared on the press release that Germany had to continue to offer protection to particularly vulnerable Afghans and learn from mistakes.
